

## Rotary Foundation Scholars

The Rotary Foundation promotes world peace and understanding through international charitable and educational programs. One education program is now called the *Ambassadorial Scholarships*. More than 1000 students worldwide study abroad as part of this scholarship program. Through grants totaling nearly \$20 million annually in recent years, students from some 65 countries travel to as many nations to study in a field of their choice. During the second half of the twentieth century, the Rotary Foundation invested nearly \$320 million in scholarships to further world understanding and peace, making grants to nearly 30,000 students since the program began in 1947.

**Rotary World Peace Fellows** are graduates of the Rotary Centers for International Studies in peace and conflict resolution program. They are chosen from a wide variety of countries and study in one of the Rotary Centers located at leading universities in Japan (Tokyo), Australia, England, North Carolina (Duke U. and UNC), California (UCLA-Berkeley), and Argentina (Buenos Aires). Another center was in France (Paris), but discontinued its role in the program after a few years. Generally, ten scholars are sent to each center. Candidates are recommended by Rotary district and competition is steep. After completing a two-year master's degree program, these fellows should become part of the solution to promoting greater tolerance and cooperation worldwide.
