<b>Year</b>	<b>RI President</b>	<b>Description</b>
1938	Paul Harris (1 <sup>st</sup> RI president)	<p>At the request of then D.G. Glennis Rickert, Paul Harris attended the district conference as the RI President's representative.</p> <p>See "Glennis Ricker Remembers" for more details of this visit.</p>
1963	Glenn Mead (2 <sup>nd</sup> RI president)	<p>On Labor Day, the Corry club dedicated a monument in the form of a giant Rotary wheel to the memory of Glenn Mead. Thirty-five tons of cut stone were used in making the emblem. It had a fountain and flood lights and is located at the entrance of Glenn Mead Park in Corry. Meade grew up in Corry and own property there for many years. The park is located on property that Mead donated to the town. Mead's career took him to the Philadelphia area and that's where he was active in Rotary. However, he always remembered his roots in Corry.</p> 
Starting in 1966 and continuing for many years	Charles "Chuck" Keller (RI president 1987-88)	<p>Chuck Keller attended the district conference as the RI President's representative. See the May 25, 2000, letter from Chuck Keller to P.D.G. Charles "Chuck" M. Waltenbaugh describing the former's relationship with District 7280, which started with that 1966 district conference.</p>
